Xenia High School Graduation Requirements

Courses	Credits needed
English	4
Math	4
Science	3
Social Studies	3
Physical Education	½ (2 semester classes, must be different classes) OR 2 PE Waiver on file
Health	1/2
Financial Literacy	1/2
Electives	5.5 Elective credits are needed to complete total credit requirements for graduation.
2 years of Foreign Language and 1 year of Fine Arts is recommended for college prep students

Basic Scheduling Information

- Many of our core classes have different levels (general, honors, AP, CCP)
- Your teachers need to sign off on any advanced courses you plan to take. Talk to them about your placement
- We have a lot of electives, but they do not replace the requirement for the actual course
 - Example: Taking two of the semester social studies classes does not replace the requirement to take Government

Fine Arts

Courses offered:

- Concert Band
- Concert Choir
- Piano I & II
- Music Theory
- Theatre I
- History of Jazz, Rock & Roll
- Art Fundamentals



Health

- This is one time course. As long as you pass this class, you NEVER take it again.
- If you do not take it as a 9th grader, you will need to sign up as a 10th grader



Physical Education

1/2 credit

Students must earn a 1/2 credit in PE (two classes) OR turn in 2 PE Waiver Form- *this meets the PE requirement but no credit is given.*

Two seasons of:
Interscholastic athletics, marching band, cheerleading,
JROTC

Students must complete the PE Waiver form and turn it in to their counselor

If not turned in prior to senior year, students will be scheduled into a PE class



Personal Finance

Students must earn a $\frac{1}{2}$ credit of financial literacy by taking personal finance at some point during high school.

Thinking about GCCC?

If you are considering applying for the Greene County Career Center during your sophomore year, keep the *ABC's* in mind:

Attendance- Your attendance must be in good standing with solid attendance record.

Behavior- Students will not be accepted if their behavior is not in good standing.

Credits- You must have your PE and Health credits completed and be on track with your Core credits.

Electives

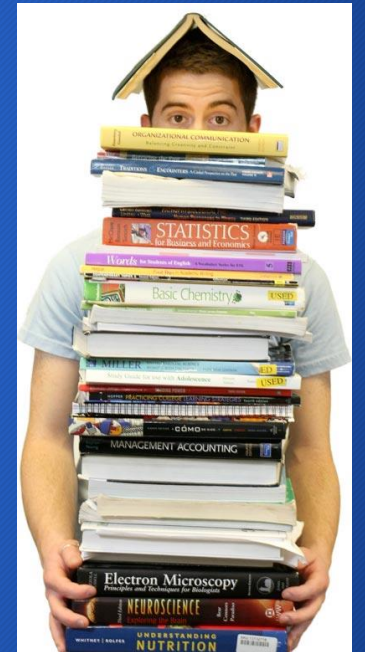
5.5 credits

- Students must earn 5.5 electives minimum in order to graduate. Electives are “Extra” courses you take in addition to the graduation requirements.
 - Examples:
 - Foreign Language (not required to graduate, but recommended for those that are college-bound)
 - Career Tech Classes
 - English Electives
 - Extra Sciences or Social Studies
 - Extra fine arts classes



Student Load

- Students must take a minimum of 6 courses each semester
 - No more than 1 study hall per semester



Schedule Changes

- Pick your courses wisely by reading the [Course Registration Book](#) (found online). Make sure you are able to handle your courses and your other responsibilities.
- Any course request changes must be made before you leave for summer

Scheduling Timeline



- You are receiving your course request sheet (the colored paper) with a course planning worksheet attached.
- This week you need to have discussions with your teachers regarding class placement.
- Use the course planning worksheet to map out your year to make sure you have filled your day.
- Course Request sheets need to be finished (including teacher signatures) by Tuesday, February 13, 2024.

Graduation Requirements

Show Competency

Students must show competency in both Algebra I and English II. This is determined based on your score on your End of Course state testing.

Competency Score = 684

What if I don't get a 684?

- Retakes
- Individual planning with your counselor

Demonstrate Readiness

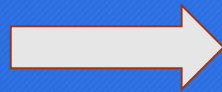
- Students must earn at least two graduation seals
- At least one must be a state defined seal
- Some seals counselors will track automatically (example-testing related seals)
- Some seals it is the student's responsibility to notify the counselor and complete any necessary forms (example- student engagement seal)

Important Local Seals Information

Community Service Seal

- You **MUST** complete a Community Service Experience Agreement Form and turn it in to your counselor for approval before you can count any of the hours.

- Charities
- Mentoring program
- JROTC Service hours
- Blood drive



Still **MUST** complete an agreement ahead of time

- Keep a log of your hours and have them verified by organization
- 50 hours of community service must be earned during grades 9-12.

Fine Arts Seal

***Any activity not listed must be pre-approved by your counselor/administrator.

Two options:

Take and obtain a passing grade in 2 Fine Arts Courses.

- a) Fine Art Visual
- b) Fine Art Music
- c) Fine Art Performance

OR

- 1) Take and obtain a passing grade in 1 Fine Arts Course AND
- 2) Participate in 2 Fine Arts related extracurricular activities during your high schools career (9-12). The teacher/advisor's signature is required to document your participation. You must complete/perform/be in good standing to verify participation.

Student Engagement Seal

*MUST be a XHS sponsored sport, club, or extracurricular activity

Three options:

1. Participate in two seasons of a school sponsored sport

OR

1. Participate in two school sponsored clubs/groups or student government

OR

1. Participate in one school sponsored club/group and one other extracurricular activities approved by your counselor and/or administration
